In compliance with Senate resolution (the House of Representatives concurring) of February 28, 1907, I return herewith Senate bill No. 6078, entitled "An act granting an increase of pension to Elijah B. Hudson."

[S. 6078. Fifty-ninth Congress of the United States of America; at the second session, begun and held at the city of Washington on Monday, the third day of December, one thousand nine hundred and six.]

*An act granting an increase of pension to Elijah B. Hudson.*

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That the Secretary of the Interior be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to place on the pension roll, subject to the provisions and limitations of the pension laws, the name of Elijah B. Hudson, late of Company F, Third Regiment Tennessee Volunteer Infantry, war with Mexico, and commissary sergeant, Third Regiment Tennessee Volunteer Infantry, and pay him a pension at the rate of thirty dollars per month in lieu of that he is now receiving.
