To the Senate:

In compliance with the resolution of the Senate (the House of Representatives concurring) of the 2d instant, I return herewith Senate bill No. 5623, entitled "An act granting an increase of pension to Nicholas M. Hawkins."

THE WHITE HOUSE, *March 2, 1907.*

[S. 5623. Fifty-ninth Congress of the United States of America; at the Second Session, begun and held at the city of Washington on Monday, the third day of December, one thousand nine hundred and six.

An act granting an increase of pension to Nicholas M. Hawkins.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Secretary of the Interior be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to place on the pension roll, subject to the provisions and limitations of the pension laws, the name of Nicholas M. Hawkins, late of Company M, Fifth Regiment Provisional Enrolled Missouri Militia, and pay him a pension at the rate of twenty-four dollars per month in lieu of that he is now receiving.
